February is Dental Awareness Month! Here are AAHA's 10 facts you need to know to protect your pet's oral (and overall) health!

- Dental disease begins early in life! By the age of three, most dogs and cats have some degree of dental disease.
- Dental disease is one of the most common health issues in veterinary medicine.
- Dental disease ultimately leads to significant, chronic pain in pets.
- Dental x-rays are essential for diagnosing dental disease as half of their teeth lie under the gumline and can't be seen!
- Anesthesia makes dental evaluation and treatment safer, more effective, and less stressful for your pet.

- Non-anesthetic dentistry is stressful, unsafe, and ineffective.
- Removing plaque and tartar from teeth beneath the gumline is vital.
- While brushing our pet's teeth is a great way to slow down the progression of dental disease, it is not effective in removing disease already present.
- Homecare is an essential part of taking care of your pet's oral (and overall) health.
